Application checklist	<p>The following supporting documents should be provided at the time of application:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Official academic transcript (online uploading) • TOEFL/IELTS/CET result if English is not the medium of instruction at your institution (online uploading) • Application for Student Residence of CityU (online application) 	

	<p>Notes for Exchange Applicants</p> <p>You must select as least 6 courses in order to submit the application. Some courses are very competitive and you may not be pre-assigned all the intended courses so please allow flexibility with your study plan at CityU!</p> <p>For courses with pre-requisite, you are strongly advised to upload a list of courses currently enrolled in at you home university together with the relevant course syllabi for consideration. It will save you time in corresponding back and forth with us regarding the proof of relevant background. Beware that course places can be filled up soon!</p> <p>If you have to complete your major modules during the exchange study at CityU, do prioritize and select at least 50% of the courses offered by your intended academic department at CityU. Put them at the top of your intended course list. Even if you are not pre-assigned with the course at the time of admission, you may have a chance to get into the course if someone drops out during the course add/drop period, subject to approval by the course offering unit.</p>
Minimum requirement	<p>Students must have already completed their first year at their home university in order to attend CityU as an exchange student. Students are expected to be in good academic standing at their home institution.</p> <p>Minimum language requirement: TOEFL 79 (internet-based test), IELTS 6.5 or Chinese Mainland’s College English Test Band 6 (total score ≥ 450), if English is not the medium of instruction at your institution.</p> <p>*For students applying for law courses, they must meet School of Law’s minimum CGPA requirement 3.0; and minimum English requirement of TOEFL 100 (internet-based test) / IELTS 7. The TOEFL and IELTS scores should be valid for 3 years from the test date.</p>
Can students extend their exchange stint?	<p>It will be considered on a case-by-case basis, subject to approval of the home and host institutions.</p> <p>Application for re-admission must be raised before 15 May for Semester A enrolment and 15 October for Semester B enrolment to allow enough time to process the application and apply for extension of visa.</p>
<p>Activities or services available to exchange students (e.g. student activity group, student club, sports facilities, wellness centre etc.)</p> <p><i>Note: Fees will be charged for some of the activities and services.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exchange students may apply for associate membership and join the activities organised by the Students’ Union and other student societies at CityU • Peer support from International Friends Club (IFC) • Off-campus Peer Support Ambassador (OPSA) • Community service work organised by the University, e.g. City-Youth Empowerment Project • Access to campus facilities including library, sports facilities and medical centre, etc.

Restricted programmes or courses (not open to exchange students)	Some courses with capacity limit do not accept exchange students. For pre-requisite required courses, students must have taken courses considered equivalent to the pre-requisite. See Notes for Exchange Applicants above.
Medium of instruction and assessment	The medium of instruction and assessment at CityU is English unless specified otherwise.
Minimum and maximum number of credits to be taken for each semester	12-18 credit units per semester. Exchange students must take full-time credit-unit load, i.e. at least 12 credits per semester in order to meet the visa requirements set by the Hong Kong SAR Immigration. A credit unit is earned by approximately forty to fifty hours of student work.
Are students allowed to take cross-faculty modules?	Yes, subject to approval by the course-offering department. Nonetheless, students will be required to take at least 50% of the credits from the same department you are accepted into at CityU.
Level of courses	Exchange students are normally allowed to take courses at undergraduate level only (course level: B1-B4) unless approved otherwise.
Any special language courses for exchange students prior to the exchange programme stint?	No.
Official Transcripts	CityU transcripts show letter grades only. A description of the grading system is available at http://www6.cityu.edu.hk/arro/content.asp?cid=498 . CityU will mail two copies of the official transcript directly to the partner institution's international office, approximately 6 weeks after the end of examination period.

Is on-campus accommodation available for exchange students?	Exchange students may apply for accommodation at Student Residence but it is NOT guaranteed due to limited spaces.
Online application for on-campus accommodation	Submit together with exchange application via https://banweb.cityu.edu.hk/pls/PROD/hwieapplacs_cityu.P_Login . Go to "Other Applications" after logging in our online application system.
Is accommodation guaranteed?	No.
Is accommodation available over semester breaks?	No, accommodation at Student Residence is not available during term breaks. In summer term, students can apply for Summer Residence with additional charges.

Visa Requirements	
Are exchange students required to obtain a student visa?	<p>Yes. Details and procedures can be found at http://www.immd.gov.hk and http://www.cityu.edu.hk/gso. Students are encouraged to apply for student visa to Hong Kong via CityU. CityU may act as local sponsor of exchange students who are accepted for admission and meet Hong Kong visa application requirements.</p> <p>Completed application form and supporting documents should be sent to the Global Services Office, Room 3210, 3/F, Cheng Yick-chi Building, City University of Hong Kong, Tat Chee Avenue, Kowloon, Hong Kong SAR at least 6 weeks before the semester starts.</p>
Are exchange students allowed to work?	No. Exchange students are not allowed to work, whether paid or unpaid.

It is mandatory for exchange students to have insurance.</p> <p>Students must purchase insurance for themselves before they come to Hong Kong. The insurance should include, but not limited to, medical and travel insurance that will cover the entire period of their study in Hong Kong. If exchange students wish to have additional insurance coverage, they may enrol in the insurance plan for non-local students at CityU.
